Re: Scenic River Evaluation of the Blackwater River

Dear Mr. Johnson and Mr. Caskey:

Thank you for your recent letters to the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) stating your counties' interest in a Scenic River evaluation of the Blackwater River within your jurisdictions. We appreciate knowing that your Boards of Supervisors have passed resolutions in support of the Blackwater River study. I also understand that the City of Franklin has taken action to begin this evaluation, although our office has not received a formal request. As yet, our office has not heard from the City of Suffolk, so we do not know of their intent concerning the evaluation.

Since we have your letters in hand, Department staff can officially begin the study process. I know that contact between DCR staff and your offices is ongoing, but we would appreciate the names of any other government representatives you wish to designate as well as learning of other contacts who could work with our staff on the necessary field study. Also, it would be helpful if you could provide a copy of each County's comprehensive plan and any land use information you have on the Blackwater River corridor.

The study will be focused on the Blackwater segment from the Surry/Southampton/ Isle of Wight common boundaries to the junction of the Blackwater and the Nottoway at the Virginia/North Carolina border. During the study preparation, DCR will be pleased to provide assistance wherever we are able. Please contact Lynn Crump, Environmental Programs Planner, with any questions. 

When the evaluation has been completed, you will be informed of the results. If the river segment qualifies for Scenic River designation, and your localities wish to proceed, then you will want to work with local legislators, who would introduce designation legislation in the General Assembly.

The Department is very pleased that Isle of Wight County and Southampton County have decided to explore Scenic River designation for the Blackwater River. The Scenic River program is a valuable tool in the recognition of the Commonwealth's riverine resources, and we are looking forward to working with you in this most worthwhile endeavor.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 09-R-031**A RESOLUTION ENDORSING SOUTHAMPTON COUNTY'S REQUEST TO INCLUDE THE BLACKWATER RIVER AS A DESIGNATED STATE SCENIC RIVER**

WHEREAS, The Southampton County Board of Supervisors, at their December 2008 regular session, directed the Southampton County Administrator to request the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation to study a segment of the Blackwater River to determine if it qualifies for designation as a State Scenic River pursuant to the Virginia Scenic Rivers Act of 1970; and

WHEREAS, Southampton County has requested that the City of Suffolk endorse the study as an interested and affected party; and

WHEREAS, the City of Suffolk and Southampton County jurisdictional boundaries are shared by the Blackwater River in the southwest portion of the City; and


WHEREAS, the Virginia Scenic Rivers Program purpose is to identify and protect significant river resources and such designation does not authorize any additional restrictions on riparian land uses; and

WHEREAS, the Blackwater River is considered an important natural resource by the City of Suffolk and is worthy for consideration as a State Scenic River.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Suffolk, that it endorses Southampton County's request of the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation to study the Blackwater River to determine if it qualifies as a State Scenic River.
